Prescribing Memo**Prescribing Reports on RAIDR**Date: 9th October 2013

Summary

A full range of prescribing reports, using ePACT data, are now available via the RAIDR system along with other practice level reports. These will complement the usual prescribing summary report but will cover a wider range of graphs and information allowing comparisons to be made between practices and benchmarked against National data

The **R**eporting **A**nalysis and **I**ntelligence **D**elivering **R**esults (RAIDR) system is a web based information portal developed by NECS which allows practice level information to be provided to GPs about their practice. Using a suite of dashboards practices can easily access the following information:

- Secondary care dashboard - This gives Practices access to all secondary care activity for their GP registered patients. Using this information practices are able to identify priority areas. E.g. Non Elective Emergency admissions per specialty, Referral rates per specialty and all A&E attendances
- Primary Care dashboard - to help with patient care, commissioning and data quality
- Urgent Care dashboard - to keep a track on urgent care activity and allows identification of patients at greatest risk of readmission
- Summary dashboard - identify areas where practices are an outlier and how to investigate further.

In addition to this a **Prescribing Dashboard** has recently been added to cover a wide range of reports at practice and CCG level that cover:

- Prescribing budget, spend and forecast information
- Prescribing Indicators
- Incentive Scheme indicators
- ScriptSwitch Use reports

Within the next few months APC formulary, wound formulary and “Red” drug use reports will also be made available.
