When using this chart, write 'see Aqueous cream wash chart' on main MAR. DO NOT DOUBLE RECORD

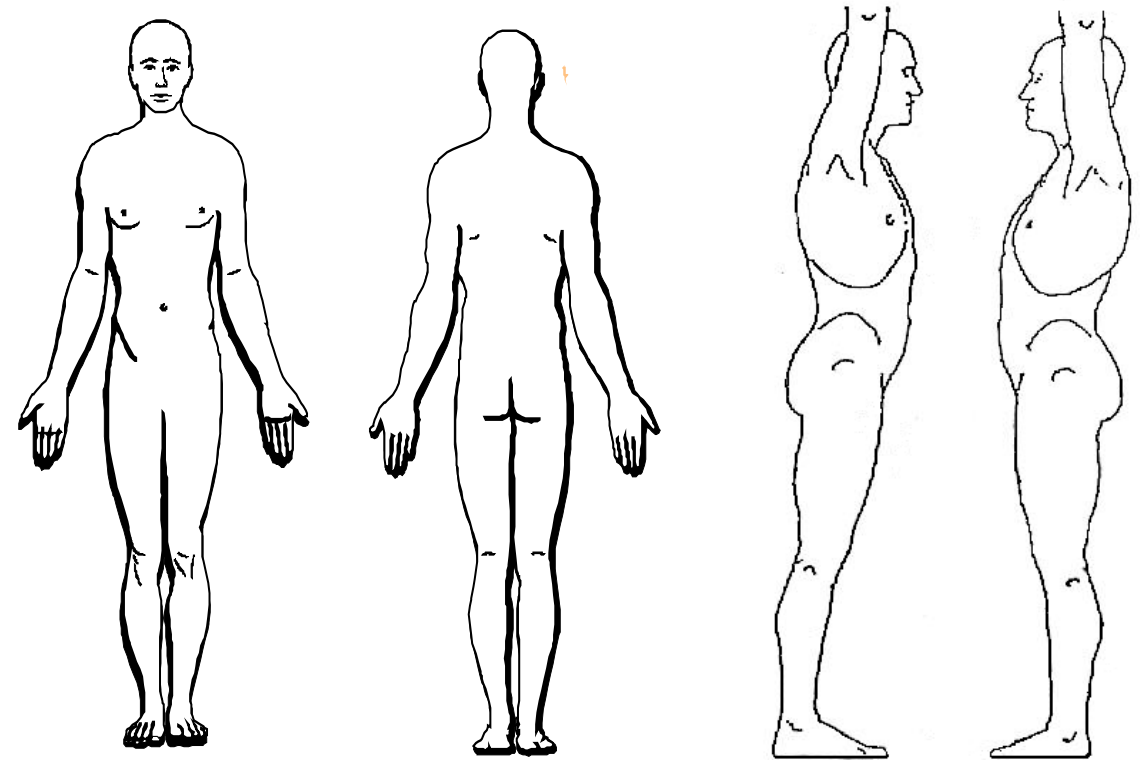

Instructions for use: Mix a small amount of aqueous cream in the palm of the gloved hand (about half to one teaspoonful) with a little warm water, and spread it over damp or dry skin. **Rinse well** and pat the skin dry, but do not rub. If using whilst showering/bathing the aqueous cream can be rubbed into the skin and showered or washed off in the bath.

Additional notes: **DO NOT** leave aqueous cream on the skin. **DO NOT** use as a moisturiser.
